BOMCA Goals

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Funded by EU (90%) and implemented by UNDP (10%)

BOMCA's overall objectives:

- to increase security in the Central Asian region;
- to contribute towards facilitation of legitimate trade and transit
- reduce illicit movement of goods and people





BOMCA Components

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- Institutional Reform
- Enhancing Professional Skills
- Strengthening Counter Drugs Capacities in Agencies Working at Borders
- Border crossing points (BCPs) and border outposts (BOs)





Major achievements:

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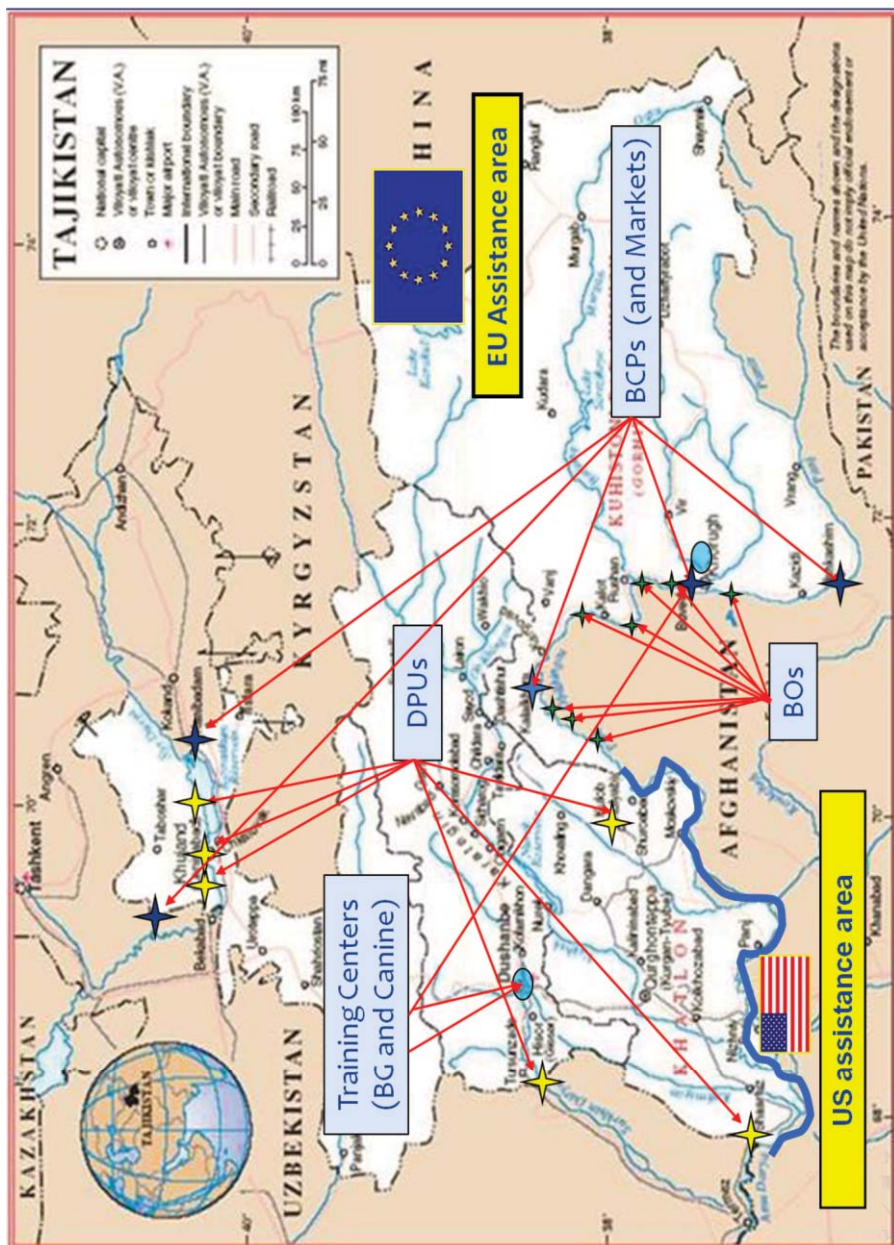
In 2003, the European Commission signed an agreement with UNDP on the coordination and implementation of its TACIS BOMCA Programme.

Since 2004 BOMCA constructed, refurbished and/or equipped in five CA countries:

- **52** BCPs/BOs
- **6** Training Centers (TCs) for Border Guards
- **4** Dormitories for TCs
- **3** Dog TCs and 3 Veterinary Units for Dog TC

Over **3,000** border force and customs officers have received varying types of training and participated in study tours.

Total BOMCA contracts amount for 2003–2014 has reached **€ 40 million**
